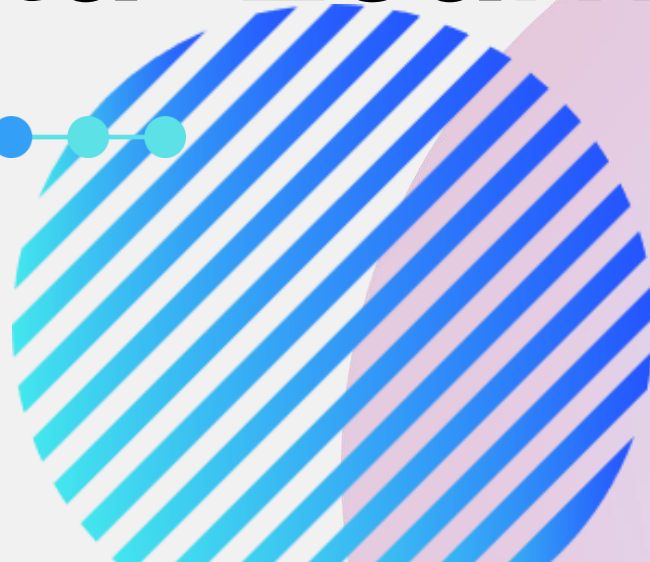

Selected aspects covered in a survey questionnaire addressed to digital learners:

Digital skills (incl. limitations)

Technical problems during online sessions

Knowledge of relevant e-tools (incl. platforms)

Resources used by digital tutors and their effectiveness

Learners' motivation to participate in e-classes

Differences between traditional learning process and online sessions

*The survey questionnaire was carried out among over **50 digital learners** from **6 European countries**.*

Best practices in online education



The areas the best practices relate to:

Introduction of new learning material

Consolidation of material/ self-study or independent work

Students' involvement activities/ interaction in pairs or groups

Knowledge verification/ exams and tests

Ways of evaluation

Given the spontaneous and immediate demand for learners traditionally learning in a classroom to move to an online environment, many of them were thrown into the deep end. However, good practices prove that in every aspect of education, remote learning process can be effective and fun, even though this transition triggered a different skill set.
